Micro Meetups

Explanation of the Name

Micro meet ups are not meant to be small gatherings in a Zoom window. Actually, they are meant to include dozens of pastors in a conversation. Micro meet ups are designed to spark an ongoing conversation about the why and how to's of making biblical disciples.

It is our firm belief that macro church multiplication will not happen on a widespread consistent level until discipleship is happening in both effective and exponential ways in the local church.

Purpose

The purpose of micro meet ups is twofold. First, to bring attention and intentionality to the conversation on the need for disciple making in the local church. Second, to provide a consistent and ongoing rhythm to resource pastors and church leaders for making disciples.

Desired Outcomes

1. Spark an ongoing discipleship conversation among pastors, cultivating congregations, and local churches.
2. Challenge every pastor involved in the meet ups to pick 6 and begin to intentionally disciple them.
3. Help pastors make intentional decisions about the system/process they are going to use for micro multiplication/discipling and then implement it. I think this is the ultimate goal.
4. Resource church leaders and churches to effectively do micro multiplication (make biblical disciples).
5. Question answers, not simply answer questions.

Micro meet ups will happen on a quarterly basis beginning in November of 2016 at 1 p.m. using the [Zoom.us](https://zoom.us) technology. We will leverage a number of presenters on a variety of discipleship topics intended to resource church leaders.
